Itinerary

- Pick up at your hotel in Puebla
- Transfer to the Magical Town of Zacatlán (approx. 2.5 hours)
- Glass Viewpoint over Barranca de los Jilgueros
- Vitromurals
- "El Centenario" Clock Factory
- Zacatlán Zócalo with cider, wine, and liqueur tasting
- Traditional bakery for bread tasting
- Former Franciscan Convent
- Transfer from Zacatlán to Salto de Quetzalapan (approx. 30 minutes)
- Transfer to Chignahuapan (approx. 30 minutes)

Tour in Chignahuapan:

- Christmas ornament workshop
- Chignahuapan town center
- Mudéjar-style Kiosk
- Church of the Immaculate Conception

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- End of the tour
- Transfer back to Puebla
- Drop off at your hotel

Description

The experience begins with a transfer from Puebla to Zacatlán, a Magical Town surrounded by mountains and mist. During the visit, you will explore the Glass Viewpoint overlooking Barranca de los Jilgueros, the colorful vitromurals, and the historic “El Centenario” Clock Factory. At the Zócalo, you will enjoy a tasting of traditional ciders, wines, and liqueurs, along with freshly baked local bread. Afterwards, we visited Salto de Quetzalapan, one of the most representative waterfalls in the region. The tour continues to Chignahuapan, where you will explore its Historic Center, the Mudéjar-style Kiosk, the Church of the Immaculate Conception, and a traditional ornament workshop—symbol of the town’s artisanal identity. A full day filled with landscapes, tradition, and culture.
