

SOULS & COLORS: ALTAR ROUTE – Unlimited Experiences

Duration: 3 hours

Difficulty: Easy

Modality: Cultural walking tour

Living tradition: color, memory, and a celebration of life

Day of the Dead is one of Mexico's most profound and symbolic traditions. In this experience, you will walk through Puebla's Historic Center to discover the altars created to honor those who are no longer with us, understanding their meaning, their elements, and the way this celebration connects life with memory.

Highlights of Souls & Colors: Altar Route

- Guided tour of Day of the Dead altars in Puebla's Historic Center
- Explanation of the meaning behind Day of the Dead
- Learn about the traditional elements of an altar
- Altars filled with color, aromas, and symbolism
- Marigold flowers (*cempasúchil*), *pan de muerto*, and sugar skulls
- Authentic cultural experience
- Ideal for couples, friends, groups, and cultural travelers

Itinerary

- Meeting point at Puebla's Zócalo
- Introduction by the tour host
- Walk through the streets of Puebla's Historic Center
- Visit to different altars created to honor the memory of the deceased
- Explanation of the pre-Hispanic origins of Day of the Dead
- Interpretation of the elements of the altar
- Marigold flowers (*cempasúchil*)
- Candles and water
- *Pan de muerto* (traditional bread)
- Sugar and chocolate skulls
- Fruit, food, and traditional beverages
- End of the tour

Description

The experience begins at Puebla's Zócalo with a warm welcome from our tour host. From there, we will walk through the Historic Center to visit various altars created during Day of the Dead, a celebration rooted in the indigenous cultures of Mesoamerica.

Throughout the tour, you will learn the meaning behind each element of the altar and the intention of this ritual, which seeks to “be close to our loved ones who have passed, to connect with their memory and their lives.” The altars are presented as spaces filled with colors, aromas, and flavors, where marigold flowers, candles, *pan de muerto*, and the favorite foods of the departed take on a deep symbolic meaning.

An emotional, cultural, and meaningful experience that offers insight into one of Mexico’s most representative traditions.
